These Children allowed to continue there studies without any Discrimination.
4. The Karnataka government is actively working on regulating private schools, particularly concerning fees and admissions. Recent legal challenges have questioned the state's authority to regulate fees in unaided private schools, with the High Court ruling against the government's power to do so. However, the government is seeking to challenge these rulings and implement measures to protect the interests of children and parents.

RTE rules and Regulations, Karnataka Education act, all rules maintain the Properly.
Schools must appoint qualified teachers and staff as per government regulations.

- 1) The Right to Education (RTE) Act is also applicable, ensuring free and compulsory education for children
- 2) It shall be provided by teachers working in the school, or by teachers specially appointed for the purpose.
- 3) For children from small hamlets, as identified by the DDPI or Local Authority, where no school exists within the area or limits of neighborhood specified under sub-rule (1) above, suitable arrangements such as free transportation, residential facilities and/ or other facilities shall be arranged. The cost for these alternative arrangements shall be fixed by C.P.I or the Local Authority as per local conditions. Expenditures on alternative arrangements shall be met by State Government / Local Authority.
- 4) The Local Authority shall identify the neighborhood school where children can be admitted and make such information public for each habitation within its jurisdiction.
- 5) Every school shall furnish a Report to the DDPI through the Block Education during July and January of the year, in Form III -giving status report of the school.
- 6) The School Development and Monitoring Committee shall, in addition to the functions specified in clauses (a) to (d) of section 21 (2), perform the following functions, namely.
- 7) Bring to the notice of the local authority any deviation from the rights of the child. in particular mental and physical harassment of children, denial of admission, and timely provision of free entitlements.
- 8) The School Development and Monitoring Committee shall prepare a School Development Plan three months before the end of the financial year. This plan will include the needs of disabled children as well.
11. Additional financial requirement over the three years period, year-wise, in respect of (b) and (c) above, including additional requirement needed for bridge courses, special training of teachers, all entitlements of children, and any other financial requirement for fulfilling the responsibilities of the school under the Act.
12. Every recognized educational institution shall appoint only qualified teachers and other staff as specified in the recruitment rules notified by the State Government or the competent authority authorized in this behalf.
13. In case of Government and recognized private aided institutions tuition fees shall be collected only from the failed students at the rates specified by the State Government or the Competent Authority authorized in this behalf.
14. The first meeting of every monthly constituted parent-Teacher Committee shall be held on the day of its constitution. An order constituting the committee shall be issued by the Head of the Institution.
15. The State Government or the Competent authority shall by notification specify the method of admission to various courses, classes and categories of educational institutions.
16. The decision of the Regulating Authority shall be communicated to the institution in writing by the Chairman and he shall pass an order to this effect which shall be binding.
17. the Right to Education (RTE) Act mandates that private unaided schools reserve 25% of their seats for children from economically weaker sections and disadvantaged groups, and these seats are to be filled through a lottery system. Schools must also adhere to age criteria, display admission details, and avoid conducting interviews or entrance tests.
